The contents of the tomb were found almost entirely intact, including the Pharaoh's mummified body, still wearing its solid gold funeral mask. Tutankhamun lived in an era when the Egyptian Empire, centred on the royal city of Thebes, was at its

pinnacle and when the wealth and power of its Pharaoh was at its greatest. This was also a period of enormous religious upheaval.
